

Trinity Lutheran School Uniform Policy

TOPS

Polo (long or short sleeve)
Oxford (long or short sleeve)
Active Wear Hoodies/wind shirts
Cardigans or v-neck sweaters (black, Royal, or white)

TOP COLORS

Royal Blue, White
(Lands End is Cobalt Blue)

Any emblem or logo's **except** Trinity's logo must be able to be covered by the palm of one hand. Shirts with Trinity logos can be purchased **ONLY** at Winning Edge in Centralia.

BOTTOM TYPES

Girls

Docker style pants (No jean material), walking shorts, jumpers, skirts, skorts, capri's, jeggings (worn only under an approved article of clothing in black, white or khaki)

Docker style pants (No jean material)

When ordering from French Toast or Land's End, you will need our school code. This enables us to receive a 3%-5% cash back from all orders. French Toast Code is QS45NDQ. Land's End School Number is 900162256.

The Classic Navy Plaid Jumper can only be purchased from Land's End.

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Special Days

- Wednesdays will be Chapel shirts or chapel sweatshirts with uniform bottoms. No hoodies will be allowed in Chapel.
- On Fridays, any white/black/royal blue Trinity attire with uniform bottoms or regular uniform.
- Once a month will be a special No Uniform Day. These dates will be published at the beginning of each school year.

Trinity Lutheran School strives to be God's family of believers. 1 Peter 1:15 encourages us to "be holy in all that we do, just as God is holy." The principles of good taste, modesty, simplicity, and neatness are core values that relate to Christian dress.

- Students found to be out of standardized dress will receive the following consequences. For the first incident, the parent(s) of the student not abiding by the guidelines of the dress code will receive verbal notification from the school reminding them that the school's dress code must be adhered to. For the second and third incidents, a call will be placed to the student's parent(s) requiring that they bring a change of clothing to school immediately. For any further incidents, parent(s) of the student will be asked to appear before the administration of the school to discuss the non-compliance with the established dress code. Further actions may be necessary.
- All students in grades K through 8 must adhere to the uniform policy at all times when in the building even if the student is arriving late or has early dismissal.
- Only hooded sweatshirts/sweatshirt purchased through the Active Wear Program are acceptable outer wear in the classroom during any part of the school day. Uniform tops must be worn underneath.
- There will be no substitutions or alterations of the standardized dress, and it must be kept clean, neat, and not torn or frayed. To alter it is to be out of compliance.
- Students are expected to participate in recess and should wear standardized clothing appropriate for the weather.
- Exposing the stomach area or upper torso of the body is not allowed. Shirts, blouses, and tops that are too short to be tucked in and/or stay tucked in are not acceptable. If the midriff is exposed when the arms are raised shoulder high, the shirt, blouse, or top is too short and therefore unacceptable.
- The appropriate length for skirts, skorts, jumpers, and shorts is no more than 4" above the knee.
- Any type of undergarment must not be visible.
- Shirts worn for warmth under standardized dress tops must be solid white, black or royal blue.
- Tight fitting clothing is not acceptable.
- Shorts are allowed during the months of August through October, April through May.
